Isaiah 53:1

Who has believed our report? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?

1. Will we believe God's report?

2 Corinthians 1:20

For no matter how many promises God has made, they are "Yes" in Christ. And so through him the "Amen" is spoken by us to the glory of God.

2. Has the arm of the Lord been revealed to me?

Romans 8:23

Since he did not spare even his own Son but gave him up for us all, won't he also give us everything else?

Numbers 13:17-20

Are the cities where they dwell open camps or fortifications? 20 Is the soil fertile or unproductive? Are there trees in it or not? Be courageous and bring back some of the fruit of the land." (It was the season for the first ripe grapes.)

Every day we get reports that differ with what God's promise declares.

2 Corinthians 4:18

So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.

Hebrews 11:1

Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.
